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PSG's double win at NECA Awards

In addition to the outright wins, PSG's work was also recognised on the final contention list of a further four categories.

Mr Williams said PSG Russell Smith was up against tough competition in their categories and should be proud of its achievements.

"Although the projects did not win at the national level we cannot forget that they represented the best in their category in Tasmania," he said.

"We are very proud of PSG Elecraft and PSG Boffa Russo on taking out national awards in their respective categories and showcasing to the industry, and clients, that we have the capacity to deliver electrical and communications solutions to the highest national standards."
